Following on from the article recently published regarding services at WHC we can inform you as follows:

<u>Leg Ulcers</u> will continue to be dealt with at WHC, the plan to move the service has been shelved.

A phlebotomist has been hired to enhance the number of <u>blood tests</u> which WHC can undertake, following the closure of the visiting service from West Suffolk Hospital. However, there is still a shortfall from previous capacity and whilst the doctors will strive to make this up, it is inevitable that more patients will have to have their tests done in Bury. Doctors will bear patients mobility and health in deciding where blood tests are undertaken.

The Health Centre and the Patient Participation Group thank everyone who raised these issues with their MP or elsewhere, especially as it seems to have worked!



A pretty full house on a very wet evening but worth it as the guest speaker was Mr. Rodney Tibbs to tell us about the Fenland.

What a fascinating subject it proved to be with many amusing details thrown in!

The Fens, mysterious and magical, a naturally marshy region drained from the 1630s to the early 1800s creating a low lying fertile region.

Fenland was known as The Holy Land of the English because many ecclesiastical institutions sought refuge during times of religious conflict. It was almost impossible for soldiers in heavy armour on horseback to cross the boggy ground therefore they felt safe.

There are records of a Nunnery with 6 nuns and 12 men who produced gallons of beer. They didn't appear to sell it so one is left wondering quite what went on.

In Upwell many of the houses were built with stones from monasteries, clearly visible. Reach in Cambridgeshire was an incredibly important inland dock at one time, hard to believe as it is now a village. The ditch which runs alongside the A10 was originally a Roman Canal, just some of the fascinating snippets we were treated to.

Next month will be our Garden Meeting which will be held at a member's home but come September 12th the Rev.Canon David Atkins will be the guest speaker with a talk entitled Hatch Match and Dispatch. This should be highly entertaining so why not come and join us-7.30 in the Village Hall.

Dear Friends,

It's holiday club time in the Cockfield Benefice! I'm not sure who enjoys holiday club more, the children or the team of adults that run it! This year our theme is 'Jungle Jamboree', and once again the children will be creating things, hearing stories and playing games centred around a jungle theme. We shall also be revisiting some of our favourite bible stories.

One of my favourite stories is the Prodigal Son, and I'm sure that I have written about this before in Green Links. Even so, I think it's worth thinking about it again. In fact, I was thinking about the word 'prodigal'. I love the etymology of words (where they come from), and 'prodigal' comes from the Latin 'prodigalis'. It literally means to use money or resources in a wasteful way — to be lavish.

I think that we could apply the word 'prodigal' in many ways to our society today. We are prodigal in many areas of our lives. This is not because we have set out to be, it is just that our society has developed in such a way that we often don't think about the way in which we consume. We are, after all, a consumer society. The structure of our society is centred around consuming, and it is economic growth that is at the heart of our society.

I think that many of us, and not just Christians, are beginning to understand that this is perhaps not the best way to organise society. We cannot keep consuming and growing. We need to think about what we are doing before it is too late. Many Christians believe that we should protect and renew life on our planet. For we believe that it is God's love that is giving life to all in our world. And, if we are truly in relationship with God, then we are participating in that love. Therefore we cannot just be observers of what happens on our planet, not just consumers of resources without thinking about the creator who brings life to everything.

I think that we can make a difference to our children's – and our grandchildren's lives if we start to take action now. My prayer is that we will begin to think more clearly and more radically about what we can do to change – and to save our planet for future generations.





