Recently the members of the Thorpe Morieux and District Gardening Club enjoyed an evening in the company of Deb Hart who is an Essex based expert in the craft of Willow Weaving.

Deb believes in keeping life natural and willow is the perfect material for this being naturally grown, biodegradable, strong and looks beautiful. Willow has been used for many years known for its strength and durability having many applications both practical and artistically pleasing.

Deb brought along a large range of woven objects including baskets for a range of several specific tasks and woven objects such as animals or hats for other pleasurable uses. Basket work, willow woven, has many common uses from coffin making to large art works for public displays.

The speaker gave a demonstration on how simple willow weaving could be, requiring little practice to produce an obelisk for supporting plants in a garden. Deb donated the completed unit to the club for members to raffle or present at some future event. The basic material used was locally grown willow with the bark stripped off to reveal a lovely range of colours. The unit was constructed while Deb continued with her presentation.

The acting Chairman for the evening, Marianne Simpson, thanked Deb for generating such an interest in weaving within the membership from her excellent talk, slide presentation and superb practical demonstration perhaps developing sufficient enthusiasm for some of the members to have a go at this craft which appeared easy to learn.

The club competition for the evening was to present A Spring Botanic Display from your garden. This attracted a reasonable entry and the speaker judging the displays declared that Carol Bailey's entry was the best.

This message is being broadcast on behalf of Action Fraud regarding ransomeware

Following the ransomware cyber attack on Friday 12 May which affected the NHS and is believed to have affected other organisations globally, the City of London Police's National Fraud Intelligence Bureau has issued an alert urging both individuals and businesses to follow protection advice immediately and in the coming days.

Ransomware is a form of malicious software (Malware) that enables cyber criminals to remotely lock down files on your computer or mobile device. Criminals will use ransomware to extort money from you (a ransom), before they restore access to your files. There are many ways that ransomware can infect your device, whether it be a link to a malicious website in an unsolicited email, or through a security vulnerability in a piece of software you use.

Key Protect advice for individuals:

- Install system and application updates on all devices as soon as they become available.
- Install anti-virus software on all devices and keep it updated.
- Create regular backups of your important files to a device (such as an external hard drive or memory stick) that isn't left connected to your computer as any malware infection could spread to that too.
- Only install apps from official app stores, such as Google's Play Store, or Apple's App Store as they offer better levels of protection than some 3rd party stores. Jailbreaking, rooting, or disabling any of the default security features of your device will make it more susceptible to malware infections.

Phishing/smishing

Fraudsters may exploit this high profile incident and use it as part of phishing/smishing campaigns. We urge people to be cautious if they receive any unsolicited communications from the NHS. The protect advice for that is the following:

An email address can be spoofed. Don't open attachments or click on the links within any unsolicited emails you receive, and never respond to emails that ask for your personal or financial details.

The sender's name and number in a text message can be spoofed, so even if the message appears to be from an organisation you know of, you should still exercise caution, particularly if the texts are asking you to click on a link or call a number.

Don't disclose your personal or financial details during a cold call, and remember that the police and banks will never ring you and ask you to verify your PIN, withdraw your cash, or transfer your money to another "safe" account.

FELSHAM PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRMAN'S REPORT - 2017

Good evening and welcome from your Parish Councillors.

I would like to thank Paula for all the work she has done for the Council, it's very much appreciated by all of the Council.

Welcome to Penny Otton our local councillor and thank you for all the hard work you do on behalf of Felsham and congratulations on your re-election.

Andrew Conquest has done the Internal Audit, again, thank you Andrew for this.

THE PARISH PRECEPT

One of our biggest responsibilities is to set the precept for the coming financial year. Our precept is therefore the amount we, Felsham Parish Council, ask Mid Suffolk District Council to collect each year for us to meet our spending needs. Typically our spending includes insurance, street lighting, grass cutting and maintenance, and donations to support village organisations and others who benefit our community e.g. the Citizens Advice Bureau. In addition, although all Parish Councillors are unpaid the Parish Clerk does receive remuneration and this cost is also covered by the precept. The precept for the year 2016/17 has been set at £6162 a rise of £399 from last year this equates to an increase of £1.11 on a band D property.

Although the precept is our principal source of income, the Parish Council can apply for other funding such as grants and funding awards to support local projects, but we do not receive funds directly from central government, and thanks to Penny for the moneys we have received from her locality budget. We also received funds from the Felsham Charity, which are used to offset part of the cost of grass cutting and allow us to provide extra help to village groups when necessary.

There is also a huge amount of work done in the village by volunteers that saves the village large amounts of money so thanks to them also.

PLANNING

Permission has now been granted for extended hours at the Gliding Club and the Gliding Club Liaison Committee still meets regularly.

We continue to have issues with the Planning Department at Mid Suffolk with them not being fully aware that the conservation area in Felsham means there are different requirements when applying for planning.

WORK UNDERTAKEN BY THE PARISH COUNCIL THIS YEAR

VAS - VEHICLE ACTIVATED SIGNS - We now have the signs up, which are being shared with Buxhall. They cost us £720.00.

STREET LIGHTING - The outdated street lighting has been replaced. However the lights were not painted black as originally agreed and there were also problems with wiring and the location of the lights.

SPEED WATCH PROJECT - This is still running, but we could still do with more volunteers.

WEBSITE - Although the website is up and running, there have been a few problems due to the way it was initially set up. We now have access to funding which will hopefully allow us to improve the site.

DOG FOULING - There have been many complaints about dog fouling, particularly on the footpath around the allotments, we have been working with the Police Community Support Officers to try and resolve this issue. We would like to encourage people to report this to the PCSO or the Parish Council.

FINALLY

Your Parish Council is here for you; your councillors are here to represent your views and help resolve local issues that affect you. If you have anything you feel strongly about, please contact our Clerk, Paula Gladwell and she will bring it to the attention of the Council. Alternatively anyone can come to the Parish council meetings and air their views at the time set aside for public participation.

Annual Parish Meeting May 2017

Village News Report

As you all know in September 2015 we purchased our own printer/copier and we have now completed a full year of printing using it. Having and using this machine has inevitably increased our overall costs and during the last year we have also purchased new production software. This has meant that for the first time we have incurred a small loss over the year (£119). In view of this we decide that we would have to increase our advertising costs, which had not changed over the last 5 years, and this increase has been accepted by all our advertisers.

In December we printed our first (and possibly our only) colour magazine. I have to say it was a lot of fun producing it but, to us, the cost seemed extortionate and future colour issues will greatly depend on the financial situation. We still have the odd hiccough, I think that's inevitable - machines breakdown, and software runs amok but, despite everything we have delivered 12 issues of the magazine within the first week of every month of this past year.

You will have noticed, I hope, that we are including dedicated children's pages in every issue. We tried for a long time to find a children's editor without success and have now begun to produce our own. It is hard work and not always easy finding material that we can use. So if you have or find anything suitable for our Kids Page then please send it to us, it would be appreciated.

The Felsham Charity (No.208013) Annual report May 2017

Charity has a very long history in Felsham and the origins of this charity can be traced back to the 15th century. Over the years there have been many wealthy benefactors who have provided for the less fortunate in the village and this is now probably one of the wealthiest of similar village charities in Suffolk. The Town and Poor's estate charity was formalised in 1914 and updated and renamed the Felsham Charity in 2009.

The Felsham Charity is exclusively for the benefit of the residents and the church of St Peter in the parish of Felsham and grants are available for the following.

- The funeral grant is currently £300 and is offered to the family of the deceased to help with funeralcosts
- The education grant which is available on application is currently £150 and is made to help with the cost of books etc. whilst serving an apprenticeship or at college or university
- A fuel grant is offered annually to all residents over retirement age to help with energy costs
- Hardship grants are available on application for any purpose e.g. nursing costs or for specialistequipment
- Interest free loans may be offered on application

If you are or you know someone who is going through trying times, perhaps they have been made redundant or they are in poor health, the Felsham Charity may be able to help. Please don't be afraid to contact any of the Trustees, they are always discrete and will never disclose any personal information to anyone.

In addition to the help that is provided to individuals the charity contributes to village groups for the benefit of the whole community. In the past contributions have been made to the Parish Council for help with grass cutting in the centre of the village and on the playing field. Further donations have been made to help maintain the fabric of the church, to support the Village Friends group, to help fund the village hall improvements and to help fund the new play equipment on the playing field.

Harry Wragge is the trustee responsible for the allotments and some are still available so if anyone is interested please let Harry know. Allotment rents were last increased in October 2013 and may be increased again this year in order to eventually reach parity with rents charged in Bury and Stowmarket.


The finances of the charity are very ably controlled by Mr Michael Shallow and continue to be in very good shape with net assets as at the end of March rising to £551,701. The charity owns two residential properties in Stowmarket and freehold land in Felsham currently valued in total at £309,000. Other funds are invested in Standard Life which has increased in value to £229,582. In the past year net income available for distribution amounted to £15,721 and grants paid were £17,700.




