In the hope of getting fitter and for a good cause, I am cycling over 1,000 miles from Land's End to John O'Groats for Bowel and Cancer Research starting on June 10th2018. I hope to raise £5000. Please sponsor me if you can on the following link:

In June 2018, a group of middle aged bums will set out on their bikes to do this. Their aim: to prove to themselves that they can do it, to tick something off on their mythical bucket list, to lose a few kilos and to raise some money for Bowel & Cancer Research.

One of the 'bums' had bowel cancer in 2008. He had been thinking that: he might do, could do or even should do this ride to mark ten years since being diagnosed. Whilst he was prevaricating another 'bum' said that he would sponsor him and yet another 'bum' said he would accompany him. Before we knew it, we had a group of bums on bikes.

The straight line distance from Land's End to John O'Groats is 603 miles but this would involve going over the Irish Sea! The traditional distance by road is 874 miles. However, the bums route is going to avoid major roads whenever possible and be as scenic as they can make it. In total, they will be cycling around 1,000 miles over 12 days, an average of 83 miles per day.

More to the point they will be climbing around 57,000 ft or 17,000 m. That is roughly the equivalent or cycling up Mount Everest – twice! On the first day alone they will climb 2,450m – Ben Nevis, the highest mountain in the UK is 1,344m high.

Thorpe Morieux and District Gardening Club.

For the Thorpe Morieux and District Gardening Club spring season of events Frances Boscawen of Moat Farm Flowers came along to Thorpe Village hall on the 16th April to talk about Flowers for the Cutting Garden. Frances has been involved in flower arranging for some time and lives in a small farm and has carried out her work with flowers purchased from national importers. Realising that the flowers were not very fresh but come from a World-Wide Flower Market which distributes flowers collected from all over the world she decided that seasonal British flowers freshly cut would be a cheaper and more worthwhile product.

Her small farm on heavy soil with a few small outbuildings was used as a vegetable patch with small animal and chicken livestock. To set out by growing her own flowers a large amount of mushroom compost was applied, some shrubs and small trees planted to provide a wind break and a poly tunnel and small green house erected. Hard work to close the vegetable patch and decide what to grow has now become a field containing a variety of flowers all seasonal and fresh to enable Frances to carry out her work with cut flowers very worthwhile. Flowers for Weddings, church decoration, event features, shows and even home displays keep Frances busy.

Many of her flowers begin from seed or cuttings etc. growing naturally in the field fresh seasonal arrangements last well and continue to give off natural scents. Favourite flowers such as Early Spring Hellebores and Tulips followed by Roses, Sweet Peas, Dahlias, Scabious, Corn Flowers, Cosmos and Zinnia's are daily cut when the temperature is low in the early morning or evening and may be added to by some herbs to include scent and texture. Always British and fresh these cut flowers have proved to be a great success for Frances.

After the talk our speaker was asked to judge the members entries in this month's competition to produce A Spring Botanic Display from their garden. From a reasonable entry from the members, Rosie Swinny's was chosen to be the winner due to its wide range of selected varieties. The Chairman, Linda Shotbolt, thanked the speaker for her excellent talk and said that she felt that many of the members would now be encouraged to grow their own cut flowers. The members expressed their thanks



with a loud and long burst of applause.




