So what is an Annual Parish Meeting?

This is your Village Meeting, it's not a council meeting! It does give the Parish Council the opportunity to report on what it's been up to during the past year and to hear reports from the various organisations and groups, which serve the community, about their events of the past year.

Who can attend?

Anyone and everyone is welcome - The Parish Meeting may by law discuss all parish affairs and pass resolutions about them. Anyone may attend but only registered electors of Felsham may speak and vote in a poll.

Will I be able to ask questions and make comments?

Yes. Not only will your views be welcomed but also it is precisely why the meeting is held. It is for you all to come together and talk about what goes on in Felsham, to discuss issues affecting the village, what you can do to improve things, make comments; complaints; suggestions; Raise anything you feel is important to Felsham and needs talking about.

Who will be there?

By law, the Parish Council chairman will lead the meeting and the Parish Clerk usually takes the minutes. Parish Councillors will be there, plus your District & County Cllr, however they are mainly there to listen and take note! The real purpose of the meeting is to enable residents to have your say on anything you consider is important to the people of Felsham parish.

How long will the meeting last?

As long as is needed but usually no more than an hour or so - but you can come and go as you see fit.

Police are warning farmers or smallholdings with livestock to be vigilant to suspicious activity as officers believe offenders, who slaughtered sheep on two previous occasions, may still be operating in Suffolk.

The first discovery was made on Saturday 23 December about 5pm in Sproughton by the owner who found the remains of one of the sheep by a stream. The carcass had been taken, leaving the remainder of the animal behind.

The second incident happened at some point between Wednesday 21 February and Thursday 22 February, when an unknown offender had cut the throats of three sheep that were grazing in a field situated off Berners Lane, near Chelmondiston, before removing the carcasses and leaving them in a small wooded area next to the field where two of three sheep were also left partially skinned.

Yesterday, Monday 9 April, officers recovered a bag close to a flock of sheep and believe the contents within may be linked to this type of illegal activity.

Anyone living in areas where sheep graze should report any out of the ordinary activity such as individuals handling livestock. Members of the public should also be mindful of being offered meat for sale in suspicious circumstances.

A CONSERVATION UPDATE

It is a good 5 years since I wrote a piece for Village News about our farmland and the conservation measures we were starting to take to help the environment. At the time we were asking people to not walk the grass strips alongside the stream on Felsham Hall Farm (between footpaths no 2 & 14). They were part of the farm's Entry Level Stewardship (ELS) to provide habitats for invertebrates, ground nesting birds - specifically skylarks in our case - and small mammals such as field mice and voles which, along with the two boxes we put up, we hoped would attract barn owls back into the area. The good news is that it worked!!



Since that time – as far as we know - one of the boxes has been used each year for breeding. The other seems to provide a 'respite care home' for exhausted parent owls! And last year Felsham Hall Farm, alongside our farmland in Cockfield and Whelnetham, was accepted onto the higher Countryside Stewardship scheme (CSS).




Many of you will have walked along footpath no 5 beside the 'dormouse corridor' mixed species hedge put in by Suffolk Wildlife Trust, and last summer will have enjoyed the strips of wild flowers providing much needed food for bees, butterflies and other pollinators there and around many of the surrounding fields. The winters have seen us leave stubble areas uncultivated and additional planting of bird food and we have seen birds on the current RSPB 'red list' including Skylarks with increased presence of Linnets and Yellowhammers in flocks of some size

This winter we have been particularly spoilt by the almost continuous presence of at least two barn owls regularly to be seen searching the grass strips and bird food areas for food on winter mornings and at dusk. We have put up additional nest boxes for Tawny Owls, Little Owls, Swifts and Kestrels among others. On other parts of our farm we are creating habitat for the now much endangered Turtle Dove.

There are a lot of footpaths across this farm, and we are pleased to welcome walkers and their well behaved dogs into this lovely area adjoining Bradfield

Woods, but please stick to the official paths and please be good enough to pick up after your dog (and take the bags away!) There is a very detailed Felsham Footpath leaflet produced by the Parish Council available on request – but if in doubt as to where you should be walking (and should not) – do ask – on any farm, not just ours. There are often very sound reasons why people should not walk just where their fancy takes them and nowadays what looks like untended land may well have been left for a reason homing nesting birds and other creatures.





On the subject of footpaths we have applied to Mid Suffolk District Council to divert part of footpath no 2, the one which leads from our front gate, across four stiles through Hall Cottage garden and on across the next two fields to where it meets footpath no. 5. The route being suggested as the alternative is what many local people walk on a daily basis anyway: around the outside of the paddocks and Hall Cottage garden and instead of diagonally off across the fields (which are pretty muddy most of the winter, especially this winter) using the well-established farm track around the outside. MSDC will shortly be consulting locally and I hope if anyone has any concerns or questions they will either attend a Parish Council meeting or get in touch with us so we can explain the rationale. At the very least it will save us putting a lot of chemicals on the cross field paths and on that basis alone complements the efforts we are making to encourage wildlife rather than deter it!

Dear Friends,

We've had a spate of thefts from three churches in the Cockfield benefice recently which set my mind thinking about crime and the Church.

I am a great fan of crime novels, from Agatha Christie to Val MacDermid. And in many of the books I read the clergy are either responsible for the crime, or they take it upon themselves to solve the crime. Just think of Father Brown by G K Chesterton, or the more modern Granchester by James Runcie (whose father was Archbishop in the 1980s).

So, what is it that attracts writers to the church and clergy? And why do they think that they make good detectives? Is it a holy calling for a local vicar or rector to solve a mystery?

I think there are several reasons for this. Church buildings and clergy houses are great settings for detective stories, and they contain lots of equipment that can be used to commit murder with!

The clergy are also supposed to be role models for how the Christian life should be lived. What we find is that they have feet of clay – and are just like all the rest of human society, with flaws and faults. This is very entertaining as well as encouraging for those who feel less than adequate in the eyes of God.

But I think the major reason is that the clergy are nosey. We like to know what's going on in people's lives, partly because we are often called to care for them and pray for them when things go wrong, and partly because we are very interested in people. In fact, we love people, which is why we're called to be clergy in the first place!

Luckily I have not been called upon to solve a murder case, and I pray that I will never have to!

Would it be at all possible to place a polite 'suggestion' in the next edition of the village news?





Thorpe Morieux and District Gardening Club.

For the latest meeting of The Thorpe Morieux and District Gardening Club the members were literally entertained during this month's club evening held in Thorpe Morieux Village Hall on the 19th March. Not a talk or serious gardening presentation but a very enjoyable performance or show depicting the life of a gardener to the gentry in the early part of the 19th century.

Mr Brian Thurlow dressed as a typical Suffolk country gardener and speaking with a broad Suffolk accent brought along some of the items or equipment as used by gardeners in around 1900. He then acted the part of Mr Potter describing his life's work as a gardener at the beginning of the century. After leaving school at the age of 13 he was unable to join his friends by taking up work on local farms due to ill health. However, he was invited to help the gardener at Glebe House where he worked for the next 50 years including 2 world wars. Potter had developed an interest in gardening when at school he had made and displayed a miniature Knot Garden winning a prize in the local annual garden show. Working at Glebe House he developed a true love of gardening progressing from boyhood to Head Gardener and eventually working on a real Knot garden crowning his life's work.

With a great gift of Showmanship Brian described the life enjoyed by Mr Potter in his rural Suffolk life of hard but fulfilling work. He was also able to pass on a few gardening tips used by Mr Potter which can still prove useful to today's gardener.



At the conclusion of the "show" club member Sid Broughton proposed a vote of thanks on behalf of the members to Brian commenting that Mr Potter had reminded several members of their childhood memories helping Dad in the garden and showing that the joy of gardening still has a place in Suffolk country life.

The club competition for this month was to bake a Shortbread Round to a given recipe. Brian (Mr Potter) kindly judged the entries enjoying very much tasting each and finally selecting a winner. On this occasion Carol Bailey showing her skills at baking as well as gardening most satisfied the judge.



Updating it was going to cost £80,000 so they set about raising funds to refurbish and extend the hall. 


