In commemoration and remembrance of the end of the first world war and the many millions who were killed or came home dreadfully wounded, 1000 Beacons of Light will be lit at 7pm throughout the UK - a century after the guns fell silent. We shall be lighting one of those beacons in the churchyard of St Peters Felsham at the allotted time. Please come if you can.



The Way We Were (an original play by Beryl Meed) – 11th November 2018

This is an adaptation of an original play written by our own multitalented Beryl Meed set just after the turn of the twentieth century and leading up to the First World War. The story is based on the names on the memorial plaque in Felsham and Gedding village hall, their daily life, their hopes and dreams and the looming



TERRY WAITE THANKS COUNCILLORS FOR GRANT AID TO CHOIR

The Stowmarket councillors of Mid Suffolk District Council voted recently to award a £750 grant to help fund the life-enhancing activities of a long-established choir based in the Stowmarket area.

Stowmarket Chorale rehearses every Wednesday at Chilton Primary School in the town, and puts on three concerts a year, usually in Stowmarket's United Reformed Church or the parish church, but sometimes at the Apex or Snape Maltings.

The choir had approached Councillor Nick Gowrley with a request for help, so as to be able to keep membership subscriptions low, at only about £5 per rehearsal, and keep its concert tickets accessible. The Council's grant will cover the cost of hiring rehearsal venues, and also help with printing posters and flyers for events, including the Chorale's forthcoming concert of Handel's Messiah at Stowmarket Parish Church on Saturday 3 November.

The Chorale's President is Terry Waite CBE, the well-known humanitarian and former hostage. Both he and Councillor Gowrley attended a recent "Come and Sing" day designed to attract new members to sing under the baton of the choir's dynamic new Music Director, Tom Appleton, who is a former member of the world-famous Monteverdi Choir.



Terry Waite took the opportunity to thank Councillor Gowrley for the grant to this choir which will enrich the cultural life of members and audience alike, providing musical joy and social cohesion in Stowmarket and the surrounding villages.

THORPE MORIEUX AND DISTRICT GARDENING CLUB.

For the regular monthly meeting of The Thorpe Morieux and District Gardening Club on the 17th September Luci Skinner from Woottens of Wenhaston came to Thorpe Village Hall and gave an excellent illustrated talk on the popular garden feature known as The Herbaceous Border.

Luci brought along quite a large range of plants which when set up along the stage looked remarkably like an Herbaceous Border in Autumn.

The talk, however, covered all seasons of the year. The term, "herbaceous", covers those plants which can generally be cut down before winter and they duly would appear again in spring from the dormant roots. The border could, of course, include some plants like shrubs



or trees to give added structure which would require regular pruning to maintain a good year long appearance of the border. It is often felt that these borders possess "low maintenance" properties but there really is no such thing in gardening which still calls for weeding, controlling the virulent spread of some plants and dead heading together with new growth propagation.

Planning the border is essential to maintain a year-round good appearance and it need not be flowers only since colour from foliaged plant stems together with grasses that sway in the breeze all add to become an all-season glorious display. Not everything is cut down in winter since some dry leaves or plant stems give good protection against frost damage.

In her very engaging talk Luci traced the history of gardens in this country since the 17th century when formal geometric shapes were common. This was followed by landscapes to look natural over large parkland. The Arts and Crafts era produced annual flower beds in strong colours looking rather like an oil painting. All of this meant the employment of many gardeners at quite a high cost. It follows that the herbaceous border today can be enjoyed in a pleasurable manner on relatively small garden plots. Luci suggested that in the spring the border might display a range of bulbs to be followed by a summer of Geraniums or Day Lilies leading to autumn's Dahlia and flowering grasses terminating with Hellebores and Cyclamen before resting for the winter. A wide choice of plants is



available today to suit soil properties and general plot positioning.

Luci displayed a thorough knowledge of her subject which she presented in a way in which club members could enjoy without complicated gardening terminology.

Very kindly our speaker judged this month's competition which was to present three

dahlias from your garden. Sid Boughton's entry was declared the eventual winner from this month's well-presented array of blooms.

The club chairman, Linda Shotbolt, thanked Luci for this rather special evening and the members, as usual, responded with a warm burst of applause.

BERYL'S VEGETARIAN AUTUMN CASSEROLE

This is a cheap, nourishing, nutritional stew containing protein and your 5 a day

Serves 4

Ingredients

3 Carrots [you can also use swede, celery or whatever you fancy]

2 Parsnips

1 large onion

2 Leeks

2 Tomatoes



Heat some oil in a large saucepan and add the chopped vegetables.

Stir for 2 minutes then add three quarters of a pint of water and stir in 1 dessertspoon each of stock powder and tomato puree.

Simmer until the vegetables are cooked [you may need to add more water so keep checking and give an occasional stir] then add a 410gm tin of baked beans.

Season if necessary. and serve with cheese scones

Cheese Scones

6 0zs Self raising Flour sifted with 1 heaped teaspoon Baking Powder and a little pepper.

Add 2 and a half ozs margarine and make a mix like breadcrumbs

Add 4 ozs grated cheddar or include some Stilton if you like it

Add an egg and a little milk [or just milk] and knead to a dough.

Roll out to 1 inch thickness, cut into circles, place on a greased baking sheet and bake at 190 degrees for 10 to 15 minutes till golden brown.

Makes about 10 scones

Serve everything piping hot.

(I find that the quicker you get the scones into the oven after the liquid is added, the better they rise).


