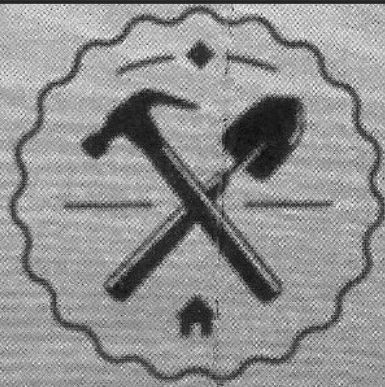

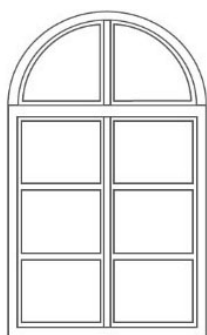

The Cockfield Benefice

Dear Friends,

October is one of those months when the Church's calendar goes quiet. We're not celebrating any festivals and we continue in what we call 'ordinary time'. However, there are other initiatives going on, one of which I would like to highlight this month.

As you have probably been aware there has been a lot in the news lately about 'Black lives matter', quite rightly following the death of George Floyd in the USA. This was followed by the focus on slavery - and the toppling of the statue of Edward Colston in Bristol which led to the questioning of some of the other monuments we have in Britain erected in the memory of people involved in slavery in the past.

Whether that is right or wrong is not for me to make a comment on, but what I do know is that slavery continues to exist across the world today. It exists here in this country too. It's known as 'Modern Day Slavery', it is the severe exploitation of other people for personal or commercial gain. Modern slavery is all around us, but often just out of sight. People can become entrapped making our clothes, serving our food, picking our crops, working in factories, or working in houses as cooks, cleaners or nannies.

From the outside, it can look like a normal job. But people are being controlled – they can face violence or threats, be forced into inescapable debt, or have had their passport taken away and are being threatened with deportation. Many have fallen into this oppressive trap simply because they were trying to escape poverty or insecurity, improve their lives and support their families. Now, they can't leave.

40 million people are estimated to be trapped in modern slavery worldwide:

- **1 in 4 of them are children.**
- **Almost three quarters (71%) are women and girls.**
- **Over 10,000 were identified as potential victims by the authorities in the UK in 2019.**

As you can see, it is a massive problem. In the Anglican Church we are calling the week of 12-18 October 'Freedom Week', and then 18 October is 'Anti-slavery' day. In the benefice we will be praying and supporting those who fight against modern day slavery. I hope that you will join us in doing this. Let's work together to stamp out Modern Day Slavery!

Hugh Fearnley-Whittingstall's Honey & Peanut Butter Booster Bars

Makes 16

*Ingredients: 125g butter
150g soft brown sugar
125g crunchy peanut butter
75g honey, plus a little more to finish
Finely grated zest of 1 orange (optional)
Finely grated zest of 1 lemon (optional)
200g porridge oats (not jumbo)
150g dried fruit, such as raisins, sultanas and chopped apricots,
figs, prunes or dates, either singly or in combination
150g mixed seeds, such as pumpkin, sunflower, poppy, linseed and
sesame*



Preheat the oven to 160C/gas mark 3. Grease and line a baking tin, about 20cm square.

Put the butter, sugar, peanut butter, honey and grated citrus zests (if you're using them) in a deep saucepan over a very low heat. Leave until melted, stirring from time to time.

Stir the oats, dried fruit and three-quarters of the seeds into the melted butter mixture until thoroughly combined. Spread the mixture out evenly in the baking tin, smoothing the top as you go.

Scatter the remaining seeds over the surface and trickle with a little more honey. Bake for about 30 minutes, until golden in the centre and golden-brown at the edges.

Leave to cool completely in the tin (be patient – it cuts much better when cold), then turn out and cut into squares with a sharp knife. These bars will keep for 5-7 days in an airtight tin.

For a lighter, more open-textured bar, substitute 50 - 100g of the oats with 50 - 100g of crisped rice.
