"I received an email today; seeming to come from the DVLA to update my general details (my driving licence is due for renewal in early November).

I began to fill in the on online form and found they asked for payment detail update which I started to complete... However, this didn't feel right, so on discussing it with my other half; we noticed the website 'http address' didn't look like the DVLA one.

I therefore wiped out the credit card details I had started to complete on the form and have since put a stop on the joint credit card which I was using.

I am not easily taken in by fraudsters, but as I am due to renew my Driving Licence in the next 3 weeks, it initially seemed a sensible request by what seemed to be the DVLA."

Of course, I should have noticed the email had taken me to the incorrect http- website address, but I didn't! It is a very clever scam but I hope this will help prevent you being caught by this or similar ones!

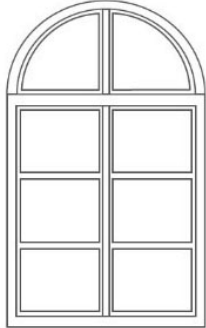

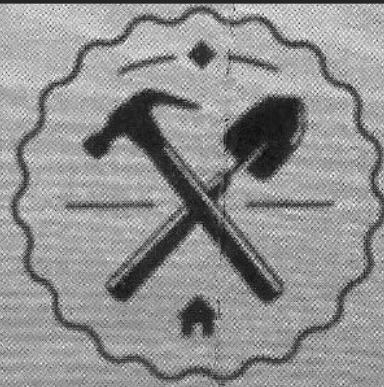

Actually they are night lights, but they will be used in our Church as a symbol of someone or something that you would like to remember during November. If you would like me and the other ministers in our team to remember your loved one in our prayers then please do fill out a card too, and we will pray for them each week on a Tuesday morning at Morning Prayer at Cockfield Church. You are most welcome to join us.

Prayer is such a comfort at the moment, and I praise God every day that we have prayer to help us through these times of uncertainty. I pray that you will find a way to help you through these times too, but if you are struggling, don't hesitate to come and have a chat!

November Recipe - Courgette Dauphinoise

This is a lovely with a Sunday roast, but I have also served it as a vegetarian main dish with a crunchy salad on side

TIME Prep 10 mins
 Cooking 1 hour & 40 mins

SERVES 6



INGREDIENTS

- 10g unsalted butter. Softened
- 400g courgettes
- 500g flour potatoes
- 200ml double cream
- 200ml whole milk
- 4 thyme springs, leaves picked
- 2 garlic cloves, crushed
- ½ TEAspoon salt
- 125g strong cheddar, grated

METHOD

- Heat oven to 180C
- Grease 23cm x 23cm gratin dish with the butter
- Slice the courgettes to about 0.2cm thick and set aside
- Slice the potatoes to about 0.2cm thick
- In a large pan heat the cream, milk, HALF the thyme and the garlic – bring to a simmer
- Add the sliced potatoes, return to a simmer and cook for 4 minutes
- Season with salt and plenty of ground black pepper
- With slotted spoon strain out HALF the potatoes and arrange in a layer in the bottom of the gratin dish
- Add HALF the cream mixture
- Then cover with HALF the courgettes in an over lapping layer
- Scatter with HALF the grated cheese
- Repeat with potatoes, then the cream and then the courgettes
- Press courgettes so the cream seeps up between them
- Scatter top with remaining cheese and thyme
- **Cover with foil** and bake for 1 ¼ hours or until a knife slides easily through the layers
- Remove the foil and cook for another 10-15 minutes to brown the top
- Cool for 5 minutes before serving

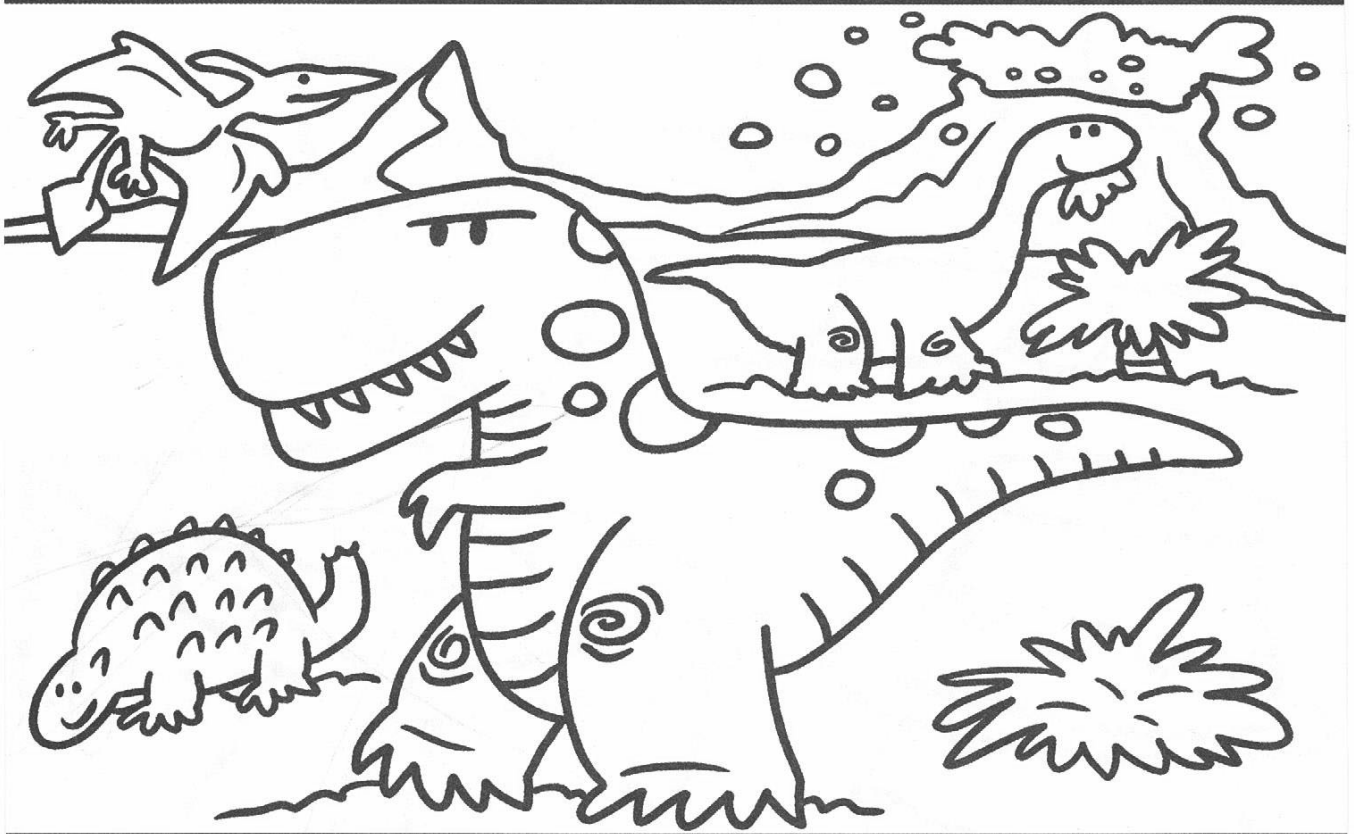
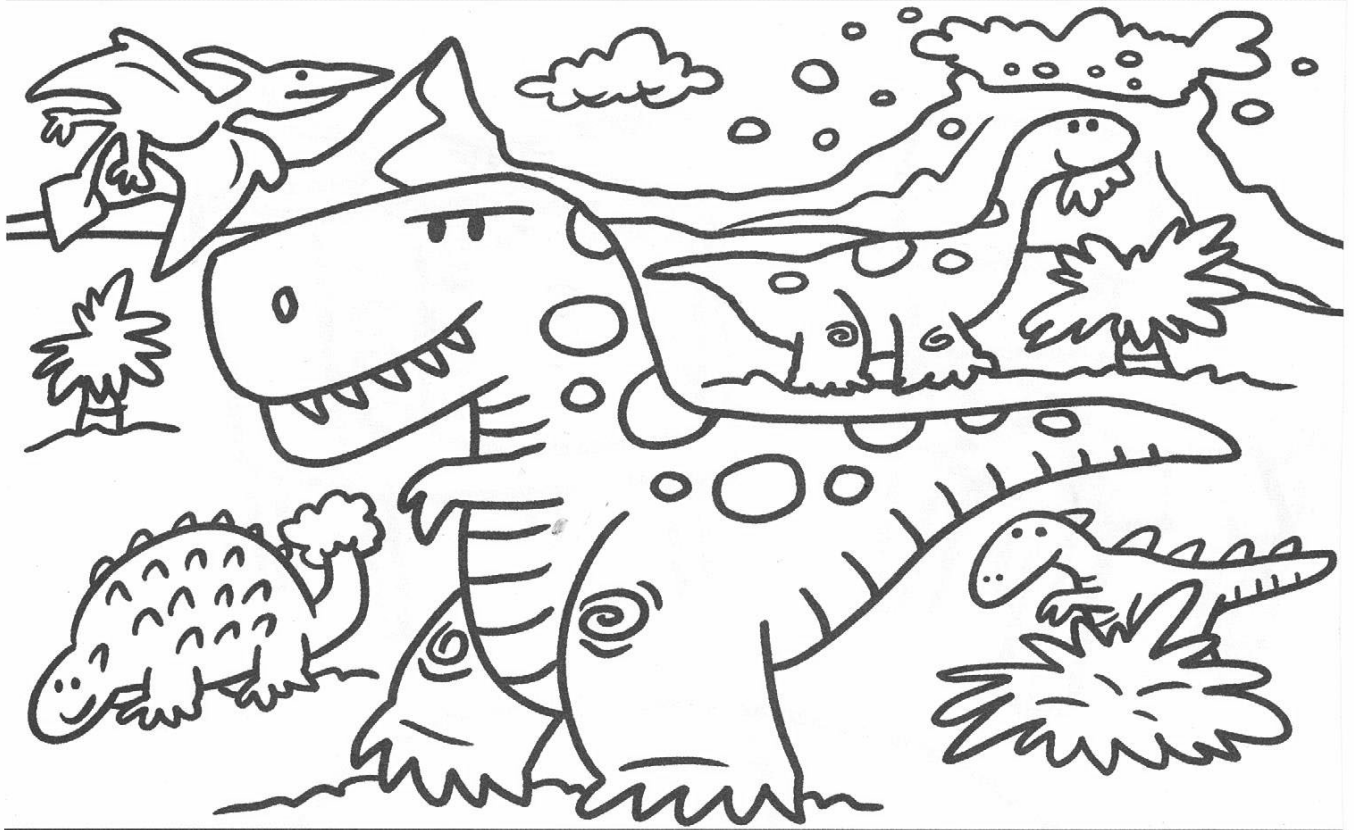

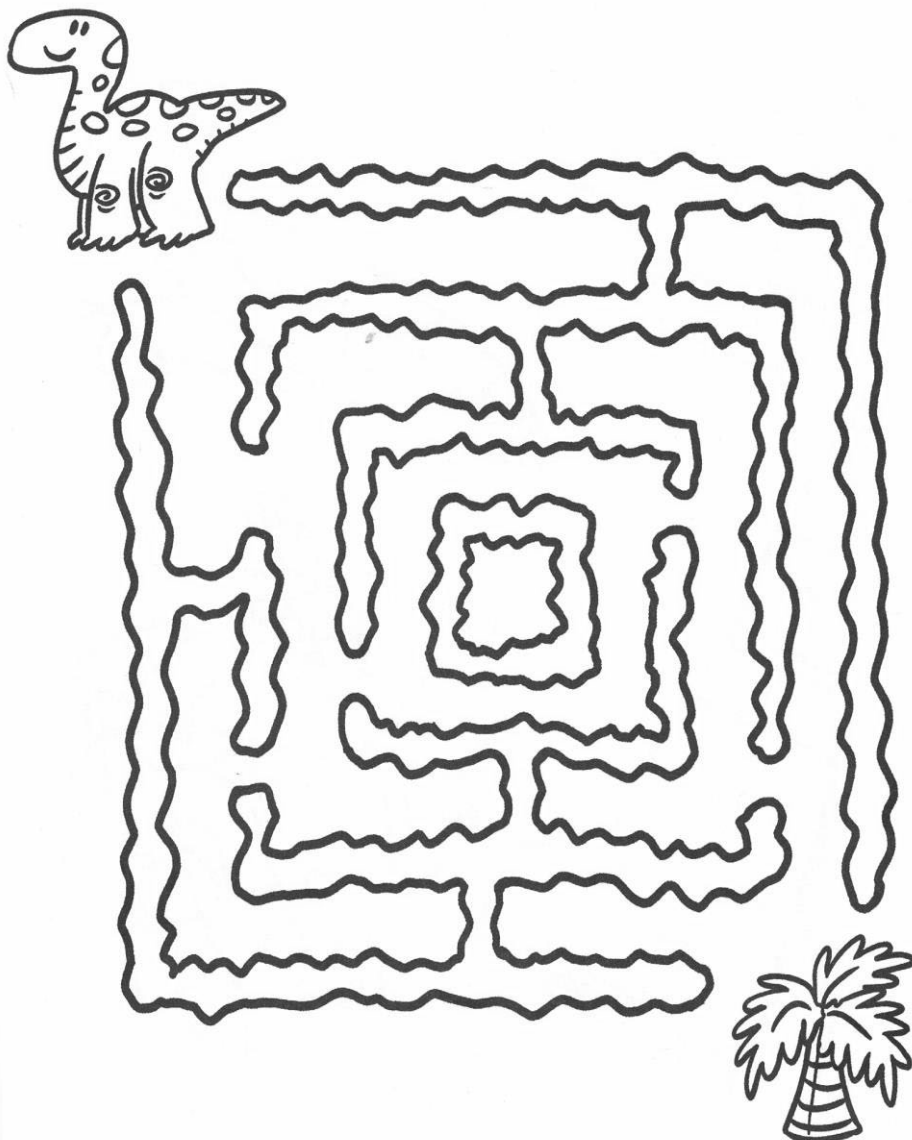
