
A Christmas Day Wedding!



Felsham and Gedding Playingfield Committee News

The Felsham and Gedding Playing Field committee has planted over 200 trees as part of the BBC's Countryfile Plant Britain campaign.

"Plant Britain" wants to get everyone planting in a big, ambitious two-year project where we can all do our bit in the battle against climate change and to help wildlife and our own well-being.

Plant Britain launched with the goal of planting 750,000 trees – one for every UK primary school starter in 2020. As our Playing Field Committee had already been allocated 200 free trees from the Woodland Trust for continuing our community woodland planting on part of the playing field they thought they'd register the planting as part of this campaign too.

The Playing Field Committee was hoping to hold a number of Covid-safe community planting days throughout January, but as our villages are firmly in Tier 4 they realized this was not going to be possible. Committee members carried out the planting between Christmas and New Year on an individual basis following a masterplan drawn up by the Village's Tree Officer, Mark Tavernor.

So, if you head virtually to the webpage <u>BBC Countryfile Plant Britain</u> you will be able to see Felsham and Gedding's contribution to the campaign on the interactive map. And if you head physically to the Playing Field you will see our actual baby community woodland taking shape.

Anyone can join in with Plant Britain campaign, so whatever you plant, be sure to log it on their interactive map. And don't miss out on their special planting ballot which gives you the chance to plant trees with Countryfile presenters at Woodland Trust sites across Britain in 2021.

Please ensure you don't trespass on private land and that you have permission to plant from the land owner.

Real Christmas Tree Recycling

If you have a garden waste (brown) bin - During January, you can leave your real Christmas tree*, with all decorations removed, beside your brown bin on collection day.


Don't have a brown bin? You can recycle your real Christmas tree, with all decorations removed, at one of our collection points listed below. Alternatively, you can take the tree to a Suffolk Recycling Centre.

*Large trees (trees that are more than 7ft tall/have a 3 inch trunk), can only be collected via a collection point, or taken to a <u>Suffolk Recycling Centre</u>.

Just a reminder about the rules for letting off Fireworks



Please respect your neighbours and their animals if you intend to let fireworks off on your property and make sure you follow the rules.

It is **illegal** to let fireworks off in the street or a public place. You should only let fireworks off on private land such as your garden or on land where you have the landowner's permission.

It is a common misconception that you can only let fireworks off on or around Guy Fawkes. You can in fact let fireworks off any time of year and any day of the week including Sundays, but you must let them off before 11pm.

Exceptions to the 11pm rule are:

November 5th - You can let fireworks off for Bonfire Night until **midnight**. New Years Eve, Diwali and Chinese New Year - You can let fireworks off until **1am**. It is courtesy to notify your neighbours if you are having a display especially if it is not on November 5th or New Year's Eve.

You can read the various firework laws that apply through legislation in <u>The Firework Regulations 2004 at www.legislation.gov.uk</u>

In addition: Everybody has their own views, but our village signage is not the place to display them and can be distracting from the purpose of the signs. This way of displaying personal views also creates additional work for our volunteers, who then have to take time to remove them.

By the time you read this we will be in unchartered territory - possibly without a Brexit trade deal, and hopefully getting going on the Covid-19 vaccine programme.

Even with the vaccine, it is going to be a tough year. We have lost people to the virus. Businesses have disappeared. Schools are desperately trying to fill the gaps for children who lost out during the major lockdowns. Health and social care are under tremendous pressure. No wonder many are suffering with lack of sleep due to anxiety, stress or depression.

To Felsham Charity who provided funds to make this happen.



The Big Garden Birdwatch



Thanks to people like us taking part in the Big Garden Birdwatch, the RSPB now have over 40 years of data and this has helped increase understanding of the challenges faced by wildlife.

It was one of the first surveys to identify the decline of song thrushes in gardens. This species was a firm fixture in the top 10 in 1979. But by 2019, those numbers had declined by 76% – coming in at number 20. And did you know that house sparrow sightings have dropped by 53% since the first Birdwatch in 1979? However, in the past 10 years their numbers have grown by 10% showing that we are beginning to see some signs of recovery.

Results like these help us spot problems. But, more importantly, they are the first step towards putting things right.

How You Can take Part

- 1. **Pick a time:** You can choose any hour between 29 and 31 January. So whether you're an early bird or a night owl, you can still take part.
- 2. **List what you see:** Count the birds that land in your garden or park, or on your balcony. Ignore any birds that are still in flight. To avoid double-counting, just record the highest number of each bird species you see at any one time not a running total.
- 3. Submit your results: Either

Online: You can submit your results online at rspb.org.uk/birdwatch from 29 January until 19 February, or.

By post: If you'd rather send your results by post, you can download a submission form below. Please post your results to us before 15 February.

Every count is important so, if you don't see anything, please still submit your result. Finding out which birds don't visit your area is as important as understanding those which do!

Make Your Own Bird Cake

You can make your own bird cake by:

Pouring melted fat (suet or lard) onto a mixture of ingredients such as seeds, nuts, dried fruit, oatmeal, cheese and cake

Use about one-third fat to two-thirds mixture. Stir well in a bowl and allow it to set in a container of your choice

An empty coconut shell, plastic cup or tit bell makes an ideal bird cake 'feeder'

Or, you can turn it out onto your bird table when solid.



Where to put bird feeders and tables

You can put your bird feeder in all sorts of places, but aim for somewhere:

- Quiet where birds won't be disturbed
- Safe not too close to bushes where cats could hide in wait, but close enough to cover that birds can easily dart to and from
- Sheltered from harsh winds.

Wherever you place your feeder, make sure you can see it when you're indoors so you can get the most pleasure from it!

Bear in mind, it can take a little bit of time for the birds to get used to a new feeder, so don't be disappointed if not many birds visit at first.

Remember the water

Birds like a drink too. You don't even need a traditional bird bath:

Try a dinner plate or breakfast bowl – anything shallow that holds water will do

Large plant pot trays work well

Add a shallow or sloping area to a pond

Use a water feature or fountain.

And remember to:

Keep it clean

Put out fresh water every day

Pour warm water onto any ice that forms in the winter, birds need water all year round.
