Launch of The Queen's Green Canopy in Suffolk

The Queen's Green Canopy is a tree planting and preservation campaign commemorating the Queen's Platinum Jubilee in 2022. Partners including Suffolk County Council are working together to preserve and enhance existing woodland while increasing both canopy cover and access to green space.

Tree Wardens will work with communities and parish councils to link up existing woodland with woodland walkways and hedgerows as part of the Queen's Green Canopy. This tree planting will create natural corridors for biodiversity and link up existing footpaths and bridleways.

Developers' Guide consultation open

Suffolk County Council has launched a consultation on an updated version of the Developers' Guide. The guide is a document to support all those involved in major planning applications in the county.

To make sure that new developments result in improvements to local communities, developers must make financial contributions to local authorities, known as Section 106 agreements, or through the Community Infrastructure Levy. The updated guide aims to support developers and make them aware of what they should consider with their plans. The consultation runs from 17 May to 28 June and can be filled out at the link below:

Dear Friends,

We are continuing to wear masks in Church, to social distance and – what is most distressing for us all – we are not singing at our services!

But that does not mean that we cannot praise God, we can do that in so many other ways, and we will continue for the time being to record/livestream services on a Sunday morning for those who like to enjoy them at home. 

Recipe Corner

Recipe taken from 'Royal Spread – The Cook book' by the Friends of the Theatre Royal in Bury St Edmunds.

Poached Plaice and Spinach Flan

rich short crust pastry
8 oz plain flour
5 oz butter
pinch salt
sm beaten egg
filling
2 med plaice, skinned and filleted
½ pt milk
peppercorns
bay leaf

4 oz fresh spinach, or 2 oz frozen chopped spinach 1 oz butter ½ oz plain white flour salt and pepper 2 oz Brie 2 sm eggs 1 lvl tbsp freshly grated Parmesan cheese

Roll out pastry and line 8½" loose bottomed flan dish. (This is very nice, if possible, baked in a tranche tin 13½" x 4½" - easier to serve). Chill for 10-15 mins. Bake blind for about 20 mins or until just cooked through. Halve plaice fillets lengthways to make 8 fillets. Roll up skinned side out. Place in saucepan into which they will just fit, and pour over the milk. Add peppercorns and bay leaf. Cover, bring slowly to the boil, simmer until fillets are just cooked, about 2-3 mins. Remove with slotted spoon and drain on kitchen paper. Strain and reserve liquid. Cook spinach - dry well, squeeze out any excess water and finely chop. Melt butter in saucepan, stir in flour, add 7 fl.oz of the reserved poaching liquid, season and bring to the boil. Simmer 2-3 mins until thickened and smooth. Off the heat, beat in the rinded and roughly chopped Brie, eggs and spinach, stirring until evenly blended. Place fish down centre of prepared flan tin - spoon over sauce. Sprinkle with Parmesan and bake for 20-30 mins or until just set. Brown under hot grill for 1-2 mins. Serve hot.
