

Ukraine: One Year Anniversary

A year has passed since Russia's invasion of Ukraine. It was on the 24th March that Councillors crossparty shared a single motion in support of Ukraine. Our Group recommended the motion, condemning the actions of Putin, as well as committed to support and welcome refugees to become a part of Suffolk communities. The 'Homes for Ukraine' programme continue to provide hosts for refugees but is in dire need of more households to come forward and offer temporary accommodation. If you think you can still help, please visit: www.suffolk.gov.uk/Ukraine.

Hosts are entitled to £350 per month, which increases to £500 after 12 months.

HIGHWAYS; /A14 this is creating a serious problem with traffic using villages, rather than the A14. I have asked highways and the police if we can have more help.

LOCALITY BUDGET;

CORONATION EVENTS; Suffolk county council will waive any fees for street closures.

FULL COUNCIL:

Over the past 12 months my Group have submitted motions for Full Council meeting.

In July, we asked this Council to declare a cost-of-living emergency in the county of Suffolk. With Winter looming, we believed more emphasis was needed on providing emergency support to the most vulnerable households. This was voted down.

In December, we ask the Council to commit further to Community Transport, as well as investigate further into why the council failed in their Bus Back Better bid. Rural bus services have been frequently cut, and the council's failed bid meant millions for investment in restoring the bus network was lost. Again, this was voted down.

I am very proud that the motion I put to promote cleaner rivers in Suffolk. Was agreed unanimously. We believe every community should have access to safe waters. The motion committed the Council to investigate further into what further work can be done to protect biodiversity and address polluting run-off in rivers, as well as working with farmers to encourage better practice.

CLIMATE EMERGENCY; in 2019 our motion to declare a climate emergency was agreed, however as there are now 31 new councillors, we decided to ask for that commitment again last month which was approved

Carbon Budget – SCC is Not on Track. Importantly, the Council's progress towards achieving Net Zero by 2030 – a declaration made by SCC in 2019. Current forecasts show that SCC will still be producing 10,000 tonnes of CO2 in 2030.

As SCC has had 31 new Cllrs since the original declaration, our Group asked Cllrs to redeclare their commitment to Net Zero by 2030 last month

BUSES; The Department for Transport confirmed in May 2022 that SCC will receive no funding for their Bus Back Better bid. The strategy aimed to improve and expand bus services in Suffolk, connecting rural areas to local and important towns. Considering just how desperate you are with the loss of many bus routes this was particularly disappointing

MIDSUFFOLK

It was a difficult decision to not stand for re-election this year, after 32 years. I know you will give Nicky all the help you have given me.

SIX BELLS PLANNING APPLICATION; again we were successful in getting a refusal from Midsuffolk.

PARKING AT THE ORCHARD' I got an officer to go there and look at the problem, they have asked the bin lorry people to also see of there is sometimes, but I do know we need to keep onto this.





We've booked a package holiday to Spain. It's our first time booking this sort of getaway, and a friend recently had a terrible experience when things went wrong on a similar trip. What sort of help is available if something does go wrong?

Firstly, tell the company or travel agent you booked with as soon as possible. This way you're more likely to be able to get it sorted quicker. If you don't say anything until you get home, you might get less or no compensation at all.

If the holiday you went on turned out to be lower in value than the one you originally booked you can make a claim for 'loss of value'. For example you paid for a deluxe room but only got a standard one, if it wasn't sorted out at the time you can claim back the difference in value.

You can also claim compensation for any extra money you have to spend while away, for example the hotel was a bus ride away from the beach rather than across the road as advertised. This is called claiming for 'out-of-pocket expenses'. If this does happen make sure you keep all your receipts for things like bus journeys.

If big parts of the trip you booked didn't happen or services weren't provided, for example a planned two-day excursion was cancelled and no alternative was organised, you can make a claim for 'loss of enjoyment'. You can also make this claim if something happens that causes you distress or disappointment, such as the pool was closed for the whole trip.

It's worth noting that there's no there's no strict guidance on how much you can claim for loss of enjoyment but any claim you make must be reasonable. You can't get compensation if you simply didn't enjoy the holiday or if the problem was out of the holiday company's control - like bad weather.

Check the information you received when you made the booking to see what you're supposed to get. If you don't get the service you've been promised, you may be entitled to compensation for breach of contract. You might also be able to claim from your travel insurance – check if your policy covers this.





As its July and we should (!) be getting some nice summer weather here are a couple of quick salad recipes



Broad Bean, Feta & Mint Salad

Serves 4 – 6 people

- 450g / 1lb (shelled weight) broad beans or soya beans (fresh or frozen)
- 125g / 4oz feta cheese, cubed
- 2 table spoon chopped fresh mint
- 1 tablespoon white wine vinegar
- 3 table spoons olive oil
- Salt & pepper
- Put the beans in boiling water for 3-4 minutes until tender
- Drain well and put in bowl
- Mix together the oil, vinegar and mint and stir in to the **HOT** beans
- When the beans have **cooled** to room temperature mix in the cubed feta and serve

Citrus courgette ribbon salad

Serves 1-2 people

This is really quick to make but if you have the time the dressing is better if its made in advance, allowing the flavours to develop

- 1 lemon, zest and juice
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 4 salad onions, finely chopped
- Handful of roasted pine nuts
- 1 or 2 courgettes, depending on size, sliced into ribbons lengthways using a vegetable peeler
- Small handfull chopped parsley
- Salt and freshly ground black pepper
- In a large bowl whisk together the lemon zest, juice, oil, salad onions and pine nuts
- Add the courgette ribbons, mix together and season with salt and pepper
- Sprinkle with parsley and serve
