Parking at the junction of The Yewlands/Church Road - Cllr Otton confirmed that 2020/2900 it was unlikely that SCC Highways would agree to placing yellow lines within the Conservation Area for this purpose. It was possible that H marks on the road could be used and might deter people. It was noted that residents had placed an article in Village News and an information board at the entrance to The Yewlands asking for consideration by drivers in not blocking the entrance or restricting visibility. It was agreed that the issues would be monitored. Cllr Otton agreed to arrange a site visit with Matthew Fox, SCC Highways officer to see what might be done if current requests do not work. 2020/2901 Village Sign - It was noted that the contractor needed further confirmation on sizes, positioning and materials to complete his quote.
